### BILLIKENS ATTENDANCE SKYROCKETS TO NATION'S TOP TEN

The Billikens' first year at the new, state-of-the-art, 20,000-seat Kiel Center proved to be an unquestioned success. Saint Louis climbed to seventh in the nation in average attendance among NCAA Division I basketball institutions as 17,714 fans per game jammed Kiel.

The Billikens' attendance increased by 4,706 over the prior season, which was the largest increase in the nation. That followed on the heels of an increase of 4,417 during the 1993-94 campaign. In head coach Charlie Spoonhour's three seasons, the Billikens' attendance has increased 130 percent.

The Billikens set a state of Missouri record for attendance at an indoor sports event in January, 1995, when 21,879 watched Saint Louis face nationally-ranked Massachusetts.

"This is a tremendous tribute to the basketball fans of the St. Louis metropolitan area and the interest that Coach Spoonhour has generated with our program," said Billiken director of athletics Doug Woolard. "The amazing thing is that we still have an opportunity for growth at Kiel."

The Billikens trailed only Syracuse, Kentucky, North Carolina, Arkansas, Brigham Young and fellow Conference USA member Louisville in average attendance last year.

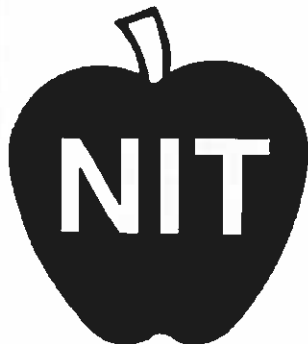

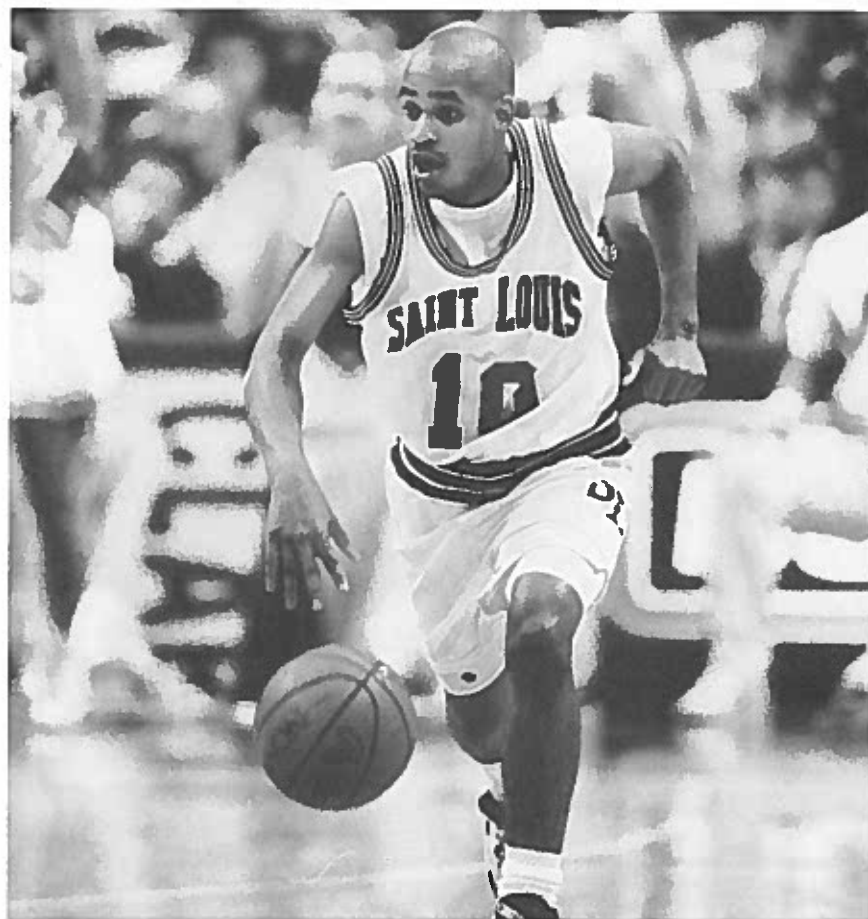
