### BILLIKENS ATTENDANCE MAINTAINS POSITION AMONG NATION'S TOP TEN

Saint Louis University's average attendance for men's basketball maintained its position among the nation's Top 10 during the 1995-96 season. The Billikens averaged nearly 17,000 fans per game. It was the second consecutive season that the Billikens ranked seventh nationally among NCAA Division I institutions.

Conference USA also enjoyed a popular debut season with 11 teams averaging 10,012 fans per game. The only other leagues to average over 10,000 fans per game were the Big Ten, Atlantic Coast, Southeast and Big East conferences.
