BILLIKENS ATTENDANCE MAINTAINS POSTION AMONG NATION'S TOP 20

Saint Louis University's average attendance for men's basketball maintained its position among the nation's Top 20 during the 1996-97 season. The Billikens averaged nearly 13,732 fans per game, which rated 18th nationally.

It was the third consecutive season that the Billikens ranked among the nation's leaders after ranking seventh

nationally among NCAA Division I institutions in both 1994-95 and '95-96.

Conference USA also enjoyed a popular second season with 12 teams averaging 8,821 fans per game. The only other leagues to top that per game average were the Big Ten, Atlantic Coast, Southeast, Big 12 and Big East conferences.
